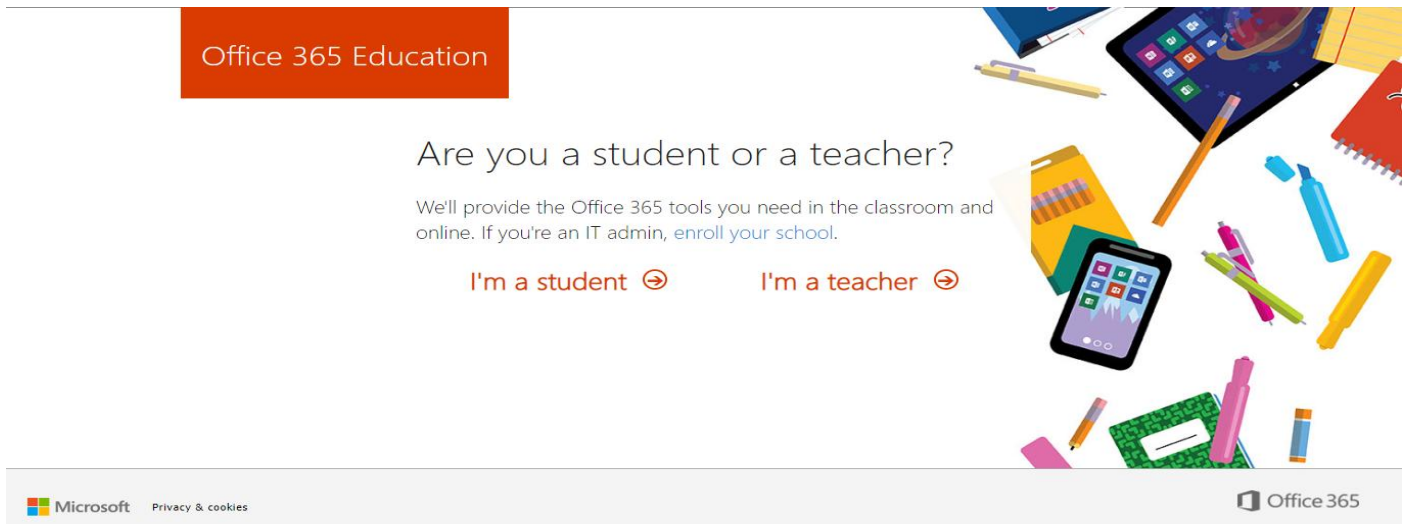
1. Search for **Office 365 education** and click on first link

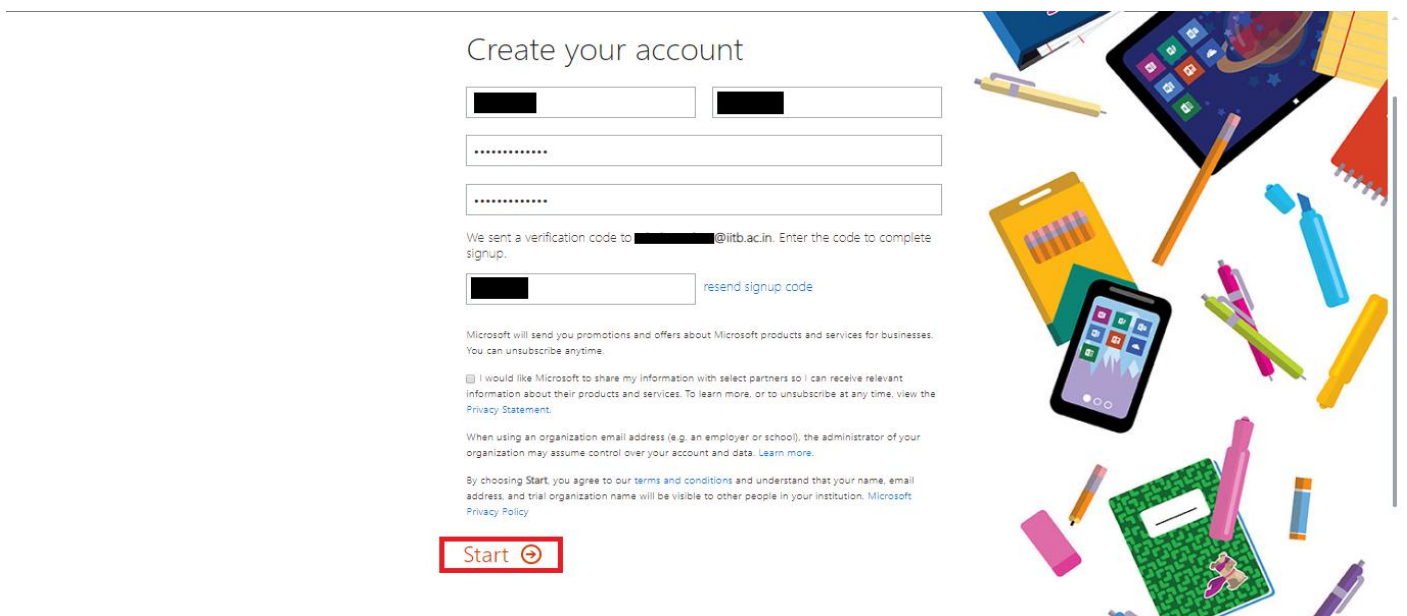
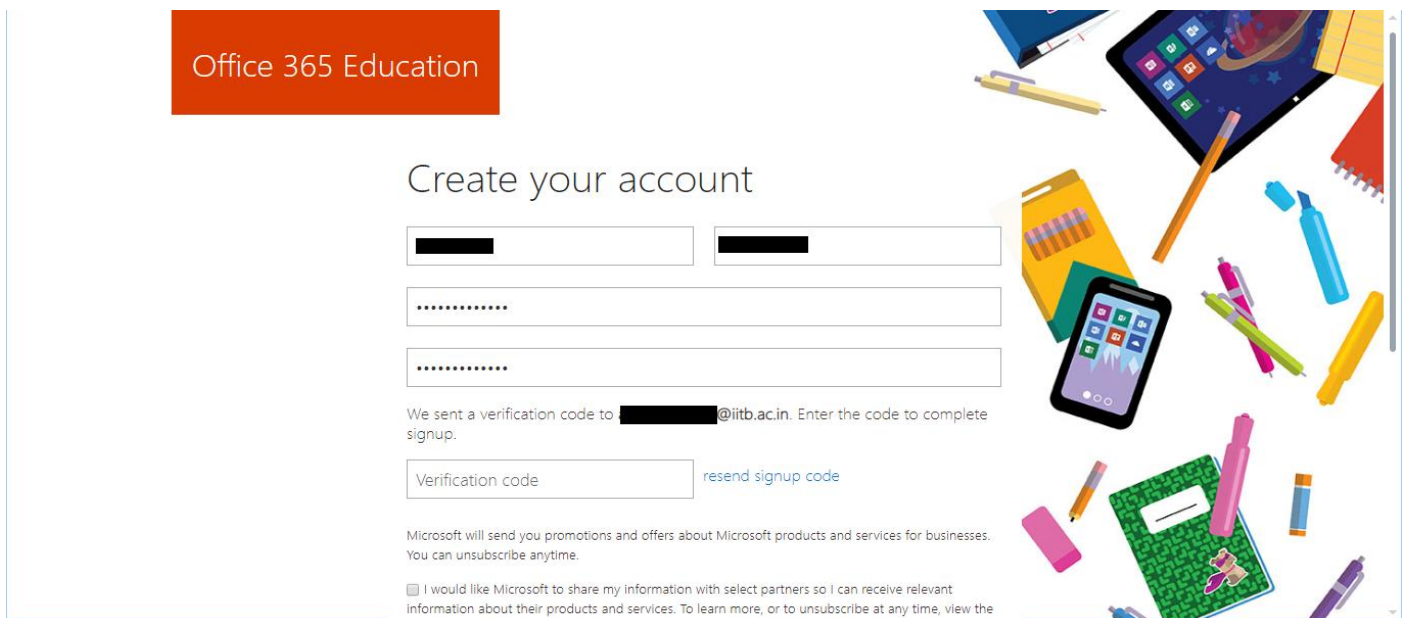
2. Enter **iitb.ac.in** email id and click on GET STARTED.

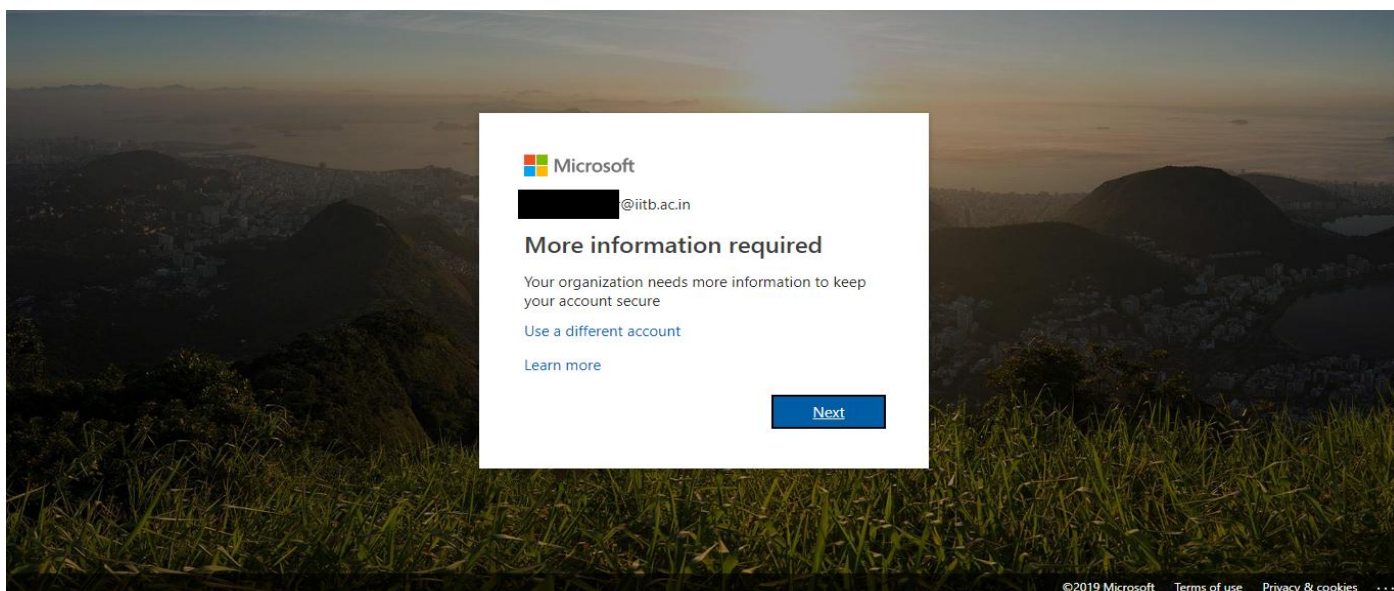

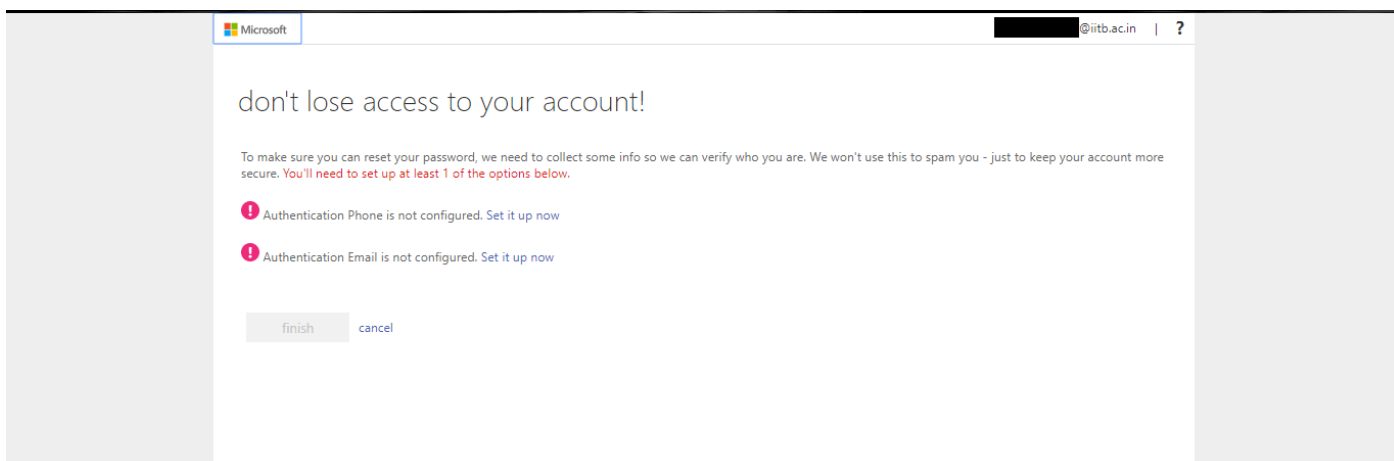

8. Enter alternate email and click on email me.

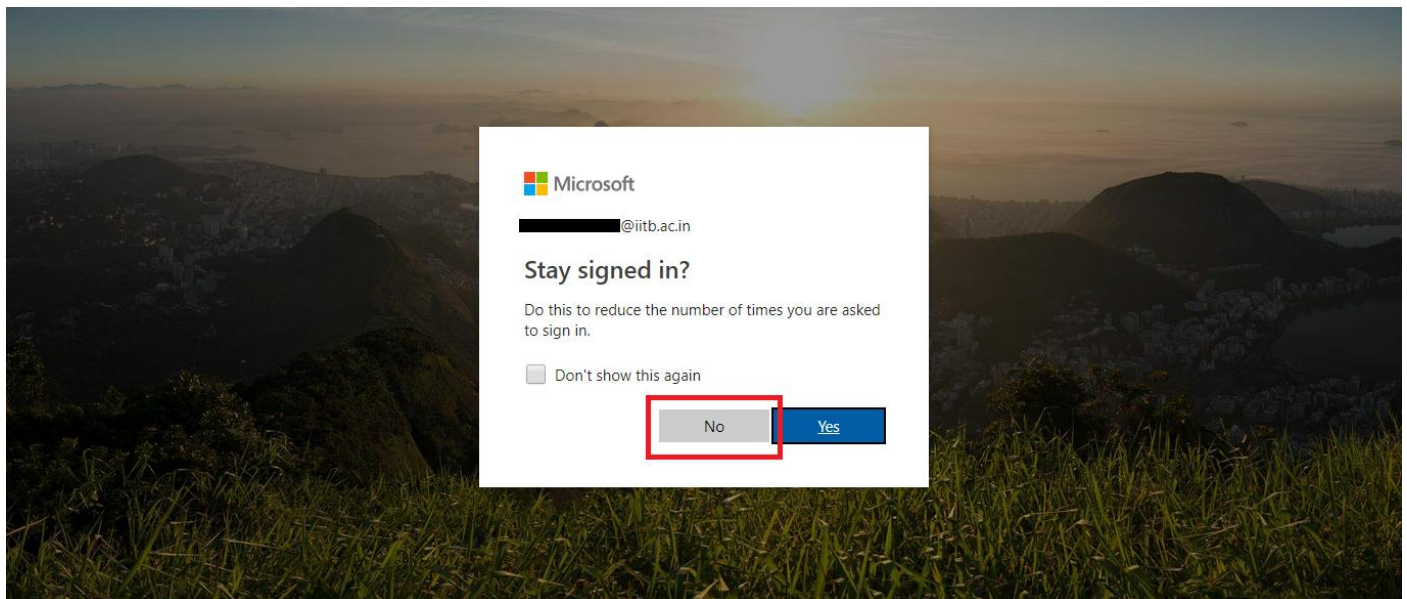

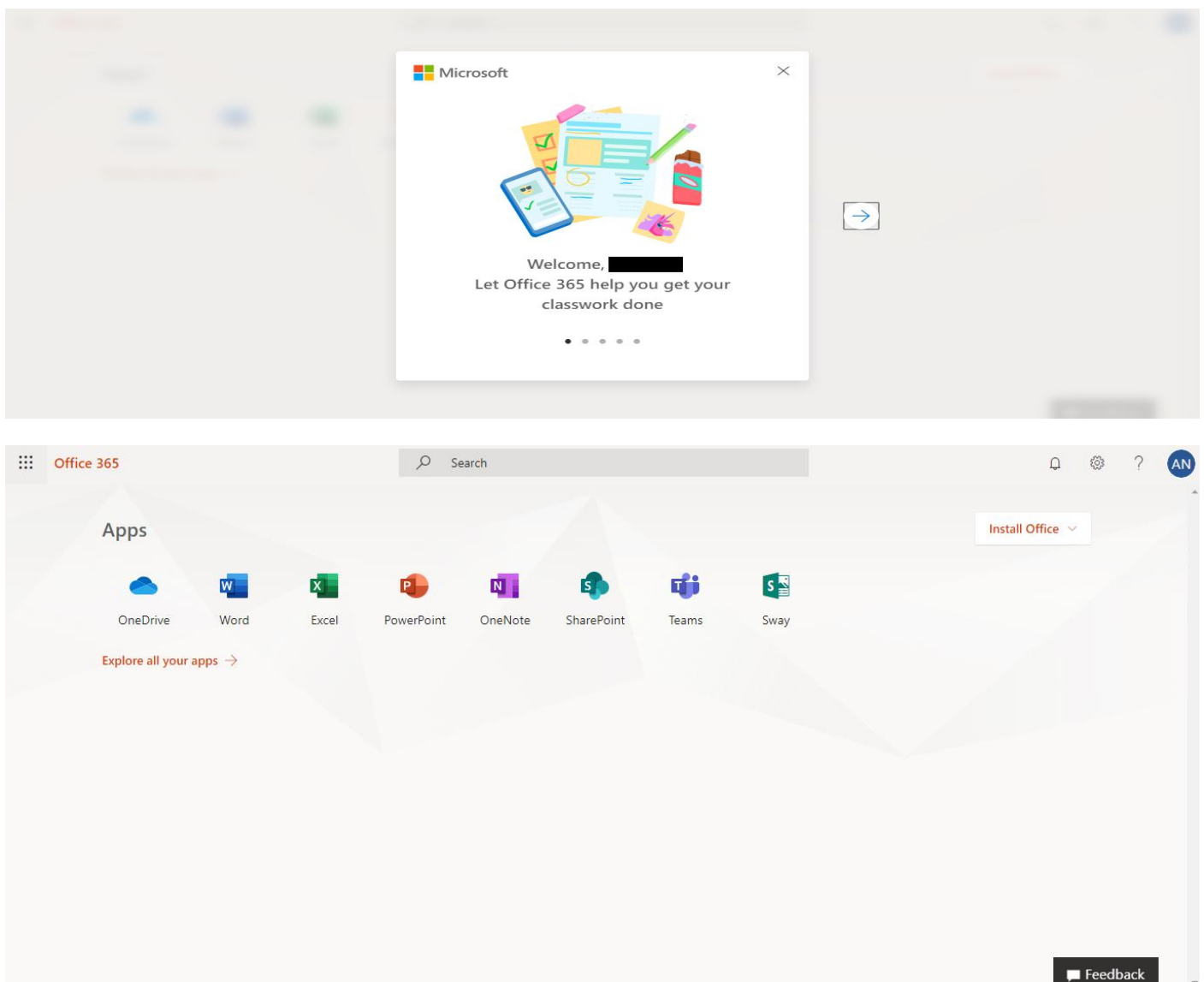

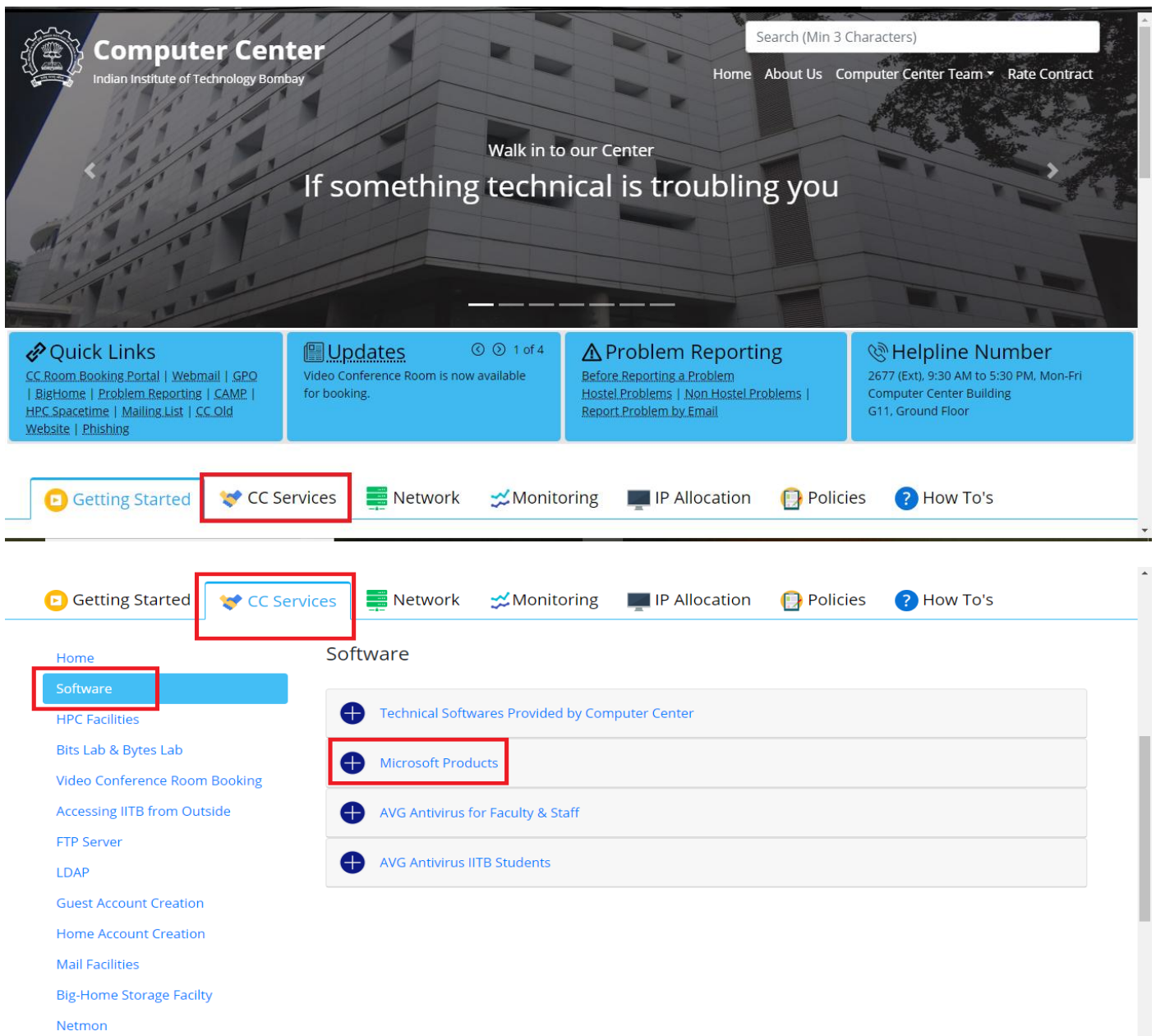
11. Close the pop-up and your account is created.

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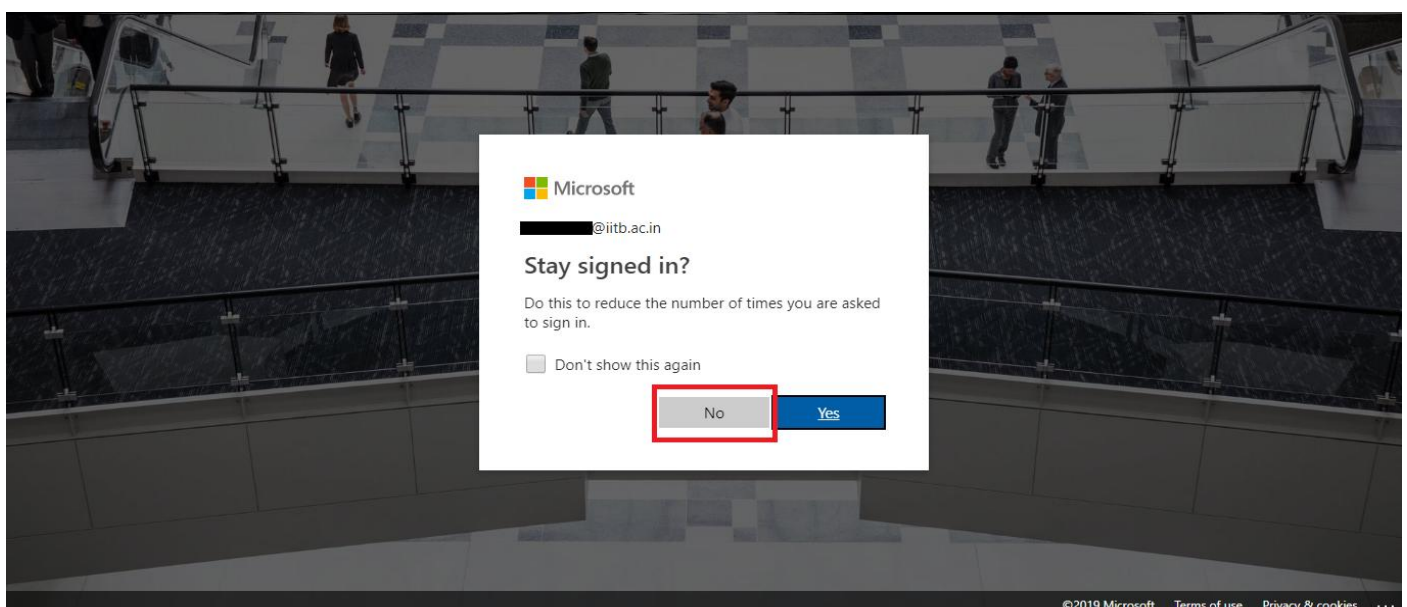
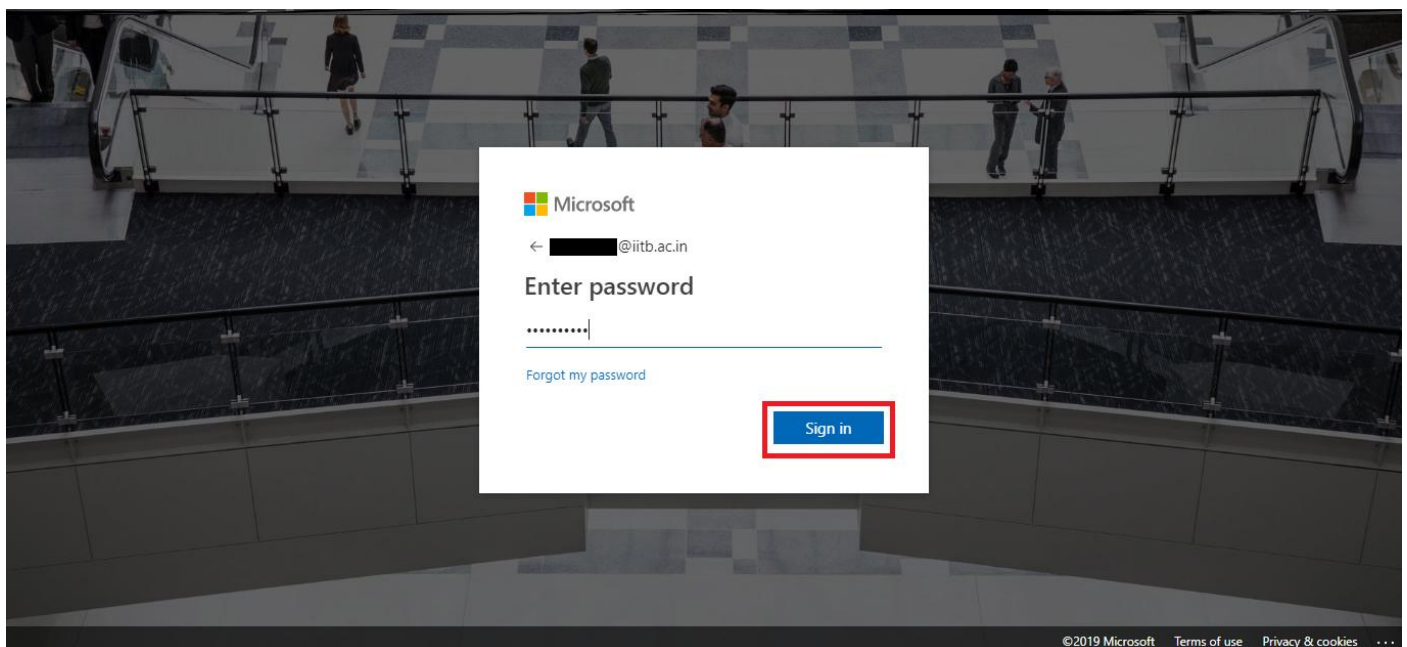
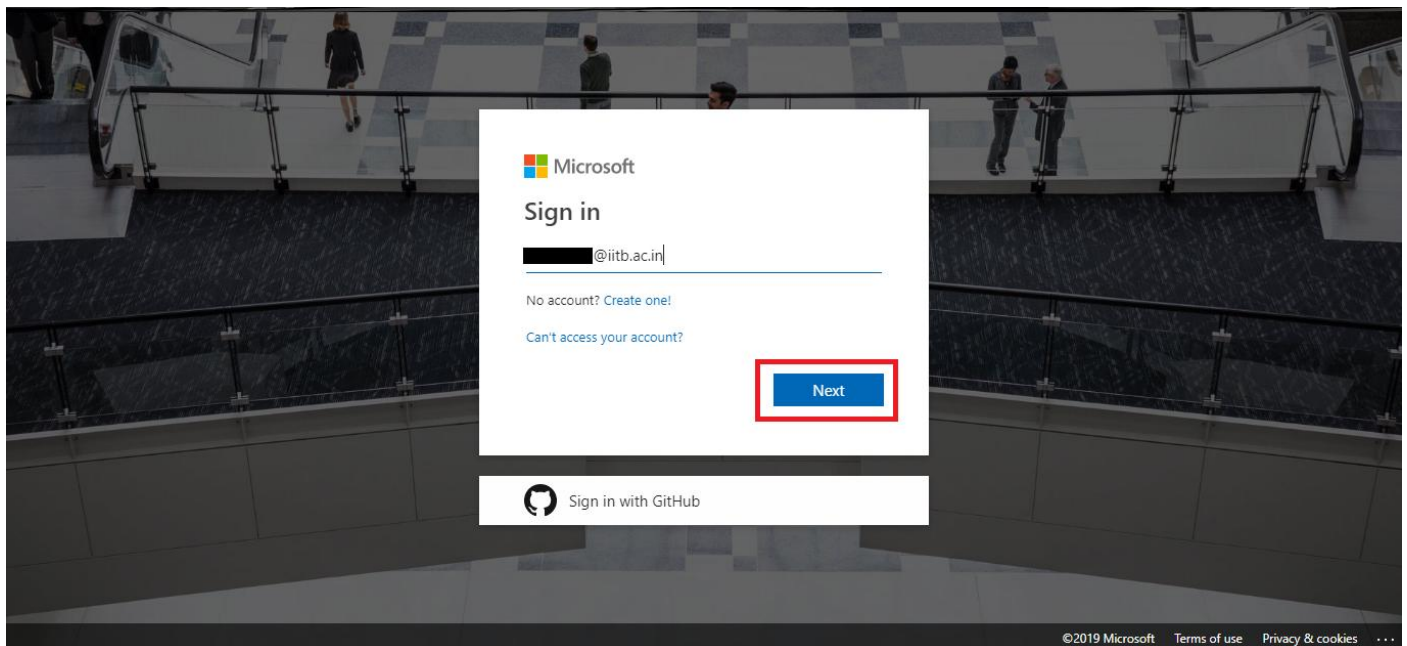
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16. Sign-in with the **iitb.ac.in** email account and enter the password you have used while creating the account.
